Is your property fire-safe ?

Diagram illustrating fire safety measures for a rural property:

- Check bridge loading for fire tanker access
- Trim branches away from power lines
- Region 1 water storage nozzles & weatherboards where embers can enter
- Put in firebreaks along paddock boundaries
- Store firewood away from the house
- If fire firebreaks move livestock to a well grazed paddock
- Store petrol and gas safely away in a shed
- Draw water from dams & ponds. Don't rely on main water supply
- Pump with spray nozzle installed
- Seal under floor spaces to prevent embers entering
- Keep a well maintained area with fire retardant plants
- Mose fitting on internal tap to house spot fire in roof cavity
- Place water pipes underground from dam pump to house
- Check cattle grid loading for fire tanker access
- Keep grass cut
- Fill water tanks & connect them to pumps for fire fighting
- Install gutter guard & keep gutters clear of leaf litter
