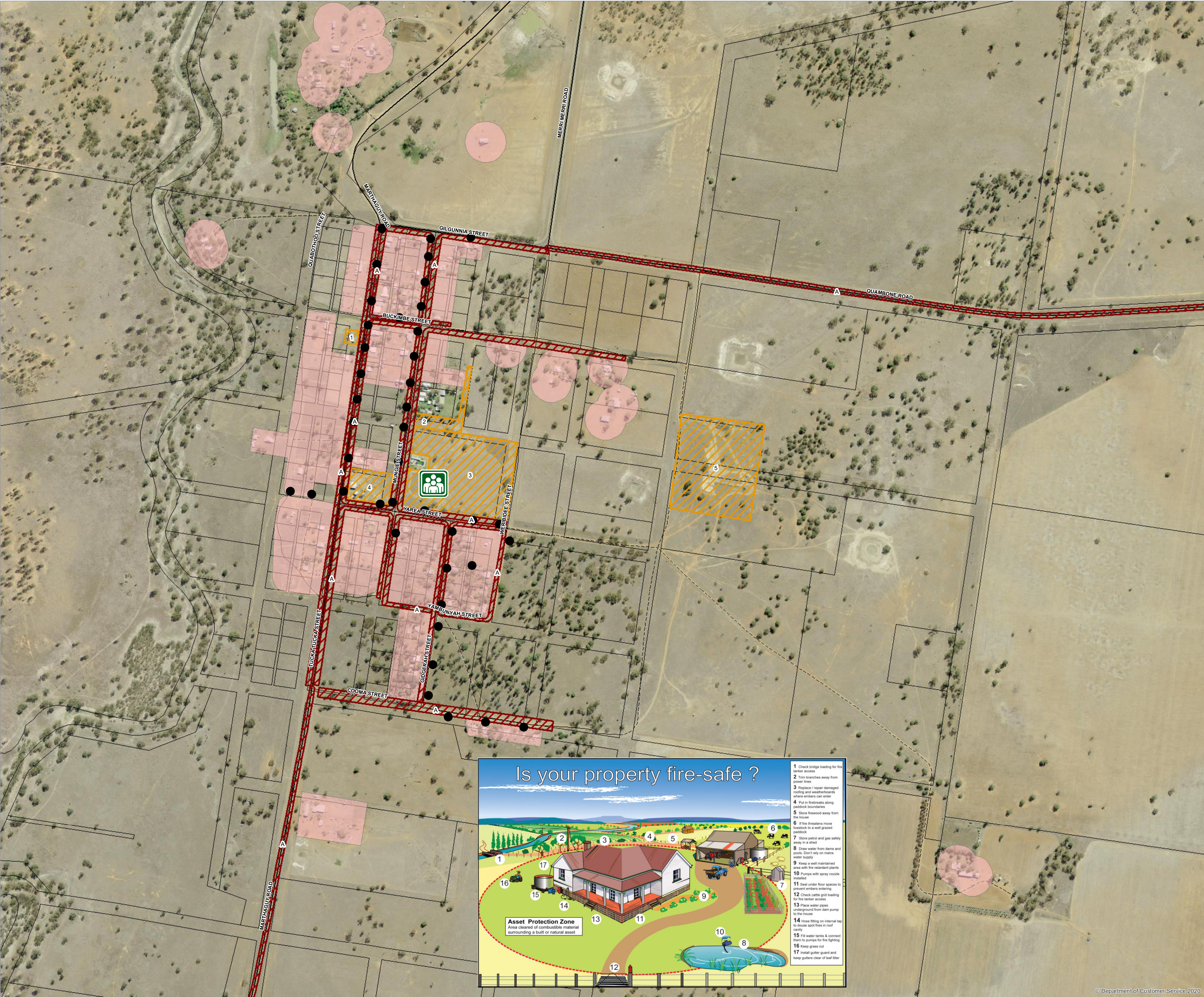

- Residential Preparation Area**
An area in which residents prepare their property for fire as shown in the illustration above.
- Transport Corridor Fire Break**
An area along roadsides and rail corridors in which bush fire fuel is reduced to lower ignition potential and to provide areas from which fire can be suppressed.
- Asset Protection Zone (APZ)**
An area between a bush fire hazard and buildings or other assets that is kept clear of bushfire fuels and obstructions to firefighting.
- Neighbourhood Safer Place**
A place of last resort during a bush fire emergency.
